

The papers that Prof. Beeghly has you write are not bad by any means, but they do feel as they have to follow a very specific structure for it to be successful. The comments she makes on your papers are fantastic, but I think the structure creat es little direction for one to take their paper. It could very well be my limiting view on the topic/question at hand, but the structure only enforced me to answer in a specific way. Regardless of the papers, her courses are very intriguing to take, and I would take another course she offers in a heartbeat.

She is very dynamic and her class is not boring. She used everything possible to make the learning for us very effective. For example, videos and court cases were BEEGHLY very helpful.
